Restore Murphy's Landing depot site after the move
Footing work -- including digging, concrete, labor, backfill
Block material, block labor
Demolition labor
Dumpster and Dumpster fees
Roof material (lumber, shakes)
Roof labor (framing, shingles)
Electrical disconnect, hook-up
Full restoration will come later

The Dan Patch Historical Society is paying the mover for the move of the depot. It is our intent to have the depot on the foundation in the Town Square by Dan Patch Days.
