Members of the Dan Patch Historical Society traveled to Toronto this week to celebrate Dan Patch's induction into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

The record-setting racehorse rose to international fame during the early twentieth-century under the care of the publicity-savvy businessman Marion W. Savage.

Dan Patch set a lasting record lasting several decades in 1906 when he paced a mile at 1 minute and 55 seconds. He first competed in Canada in 1901, eventually defeating the best Canadian pacing horse of all time, Harold H.
