100th ANNIVERSARY EDITION

100th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION AT THE MINNESOTA STATE FAIR

September 2, 2006 was designated as DAN PATCH DAY at the MN State Fair to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Dan Patch setting the record complete with a governor's proclamation and postmarks at the United States postal station located within the fairgrounds. After months of meetings and planning the big day arrived. We provided a display

to fill a 20 by 40 foot tent and the fair provided buttons and coloring sheets depicting the day. George Augustinack and Tausha Chamberland created the display of articles and photos not seen before. It included a 16 foot banner of the 100 years plus a 12 foot banner of the International

Stock Food Farm. Jens Bohn displayed his vast collection including a M.W. Savage washing machine (circa 1924), a Dan Patch Wringer, a Dan Patch Oak (stove) circa 1912. In display cases he had a Dan Patch watch, knives, a padlock, many tins and a wagon. Among Rob Fendler's many items were another style wagon, a Dan Patch fire extinguisher

and a straight razor. TV monitors continuously played footage from the race 100 year ago and other interviews. Members participated in the flag raising ceremony, were presented a governor's proclamation and had entrants in the parade. Members of the DPHS wore shirts





THE DEPOT HAS ARRIVED!

The depot officially arrived at its new location on the town square in downtown Savage at 4AM on July 29. To accomplish the move, the roof was cut into four sections and moved on flatbeds. Lunak Movers moved the main part in the middle of the night. Its circuitous route from Shakopee to Savage, via Burnsville, took a little over two hours. The depot is on new footings / foundation and waterproofed with the roof in place and new wooden shingles. Plans are being formulated and funding secured to replace the windows and the siding. Both will look just like the



original. The interior will be preserved as much as possible. We are keeping a list of all donations of money, labor and supplies. Those donors will be listed in our next newsletter in appreciation of their support. The city is in negotiation with a private party for a coffee shop to open in the spring.

BRICK WALK OF FAME

The engraved bricks for the walk of fame at the Savage depot project arrived on August 28. We sold a total of 214 bricks - 151 of the 4 by 8 size and 63 of the 8 by 8. With a goal of 200 bricks, we are happy to report a total income of \$25,812. They have been safely stored until plans are finalized for installation. They will be officially installed and unveiled at the dedication and opening of the depot in the spring of 2007. For now, you will have an opportunity to view your brick at the Depot Fest on October 21 from 9AM until noon at the depot site, sponsored by the City of Savage and the Dan Patch Historical Society.

There will be pony rides, a bake sale, vendors selling autumn harvest items and we will be selling bricks and books. Our brick sale has been extended until February 1, 2007 for those who missed the original opportunity. Check the website or call 952-890-4152.

After the Depot Fest the bricks will be placed in the display case at the entrance of the Savage Public Library until they are officially installed at the depot.

The Dan Patch Award



What is the Dan Patch Award?

Since 1966, one member of the MN 4-H horse project has been awarded the Dan Patch Award. The award is based on the individuals overall achievement, leadership and service.

In 1970 the family of the late Harold Savage, of International Sugar Feed Company of Minneapolis, provided the funds for the traveling plaque known as the Dan Patch Award. The plaque bears picture of his father's famous pacer, Dan Patch, who set the world pacing record for the mile of 1:55 on September 8, 1906 at the Minnesota State Fair.

The accompanying individual plaques have been sponsored by the family of Harold Savage, and the Ralph Larson family, Annie Bucher and currently the Minnesota 4-H Association. Since 2005, a scholarship donated by Double-O-Farrier service, Cory "Ole" Olson, has also been awarded to the Dan Patch winner. This year the president of the Dan Patch Historical Society, Jens Bohn, had the honor of presenting the 2006 Dan Patch Award on September 14 to Joseph Dunleavy, son of Tim and Melissa Dunleavy of rural Spicer, Minnesota.
